





Focus Areas

- 1. 133.35 crores fish seed stocked over a period of 3 years from 2015-16 to 2018-19 in 26376 water bodies at a cost of Rs.117.42 crores
- 2. 4.29 crores of hatchery sourced scampi juveniles stocked in 11 water bodies during 2017-18 & 24 water bodies during 2018-19 with a total cost of Rs.7.65 crores
- 3. Promoting fish seed hatcheries and rearing ponds under IFDS and BRS towards achieving self sufficiency in fish seed production
- 4. Extended cage culture to 20 reservoirs in 9 districts and established 846 cages with Rs.25.38 crores and taken up collaborative project with technical support from the Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (CIFRI) for raising alternate species
- 5. Encouraging Re-Circulatory Aquaculture System (RAS) under IFDS & BRS
- 6. Granted funds for construction of 500 community halls for the fishermen societies
- 7. Benefits under IFDS,
 - 42,173 No. of two wheelers, 1,829 Luggage Autos, 323 Mobile Fish outlets, 39
 Hygienic transport vehicles, 1,836 Nets, 3,135 units of plastic fish crates extended to 44,465 beneficiaries at a cost of Rs.357.52 crores
 - Extended assistance of Rs.3 to 5 lakhs each to 74 Fisherwomen Cooperative Societies as Revolving fund amounting to Rs.1.66 crores
 - Construction of 3 wholesale fish markets, two training centres (one at state level and another at district level) with the cost of Rs.3.38 crores are sanctioned

- 173 Fish Food Kiosks, 9 Insulated trucks, 10 Ornamental fish units, 11 RAS units, 9 Ice plants, 5 small fish feed mills, 4 Aquatourism units, 1 fish processing unit, etc with an amount of Rs.17.21 crores
- 8. Taken up collaborative projects with national level institutions which are in progress;
 - Fish seed rearing in cages and diversification of species for cage culture - Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (CIFRI), Barrackpore.
 - Assessment of new species of
 Pangasius silasi discovered in Nagarjuna sagar project by National Bureau of Fish Genetic Resources
 (NBFGR), Lucknow for commercial production.
 - Murrel breeding & seed production technology taken up for Telangana with CIFA, Bhubaneshwar.
- Developed database of societies, members, license holders and water bodies.
- 10. Conducted trainings, awareness programs and exposure visits for stakeholders
- 11. Earmarked 1 % of total water spread area in the water bodies for intensive and innovative activities like cage culture & pen culture.
- 12. Department of Fisheries won the "Award of Appreciation" of CSI Nihilent e-Governance awards 2018 for Fisheries Benefit Monitoring System developed in collaboration with NIC.
